

# 1. The Opening Chapter

## A Year of Alignment

The year 2025 was defined by coherence and continued realignment with the MI's vision. Our strategic goal was to ensure that every initiative—whether educational, research-based, or network-related—contributed to a single narrative: centering the Revelation in our life, learning and leadership.



Following the MI Strategy 2024–2028, which highlighted educated and concerned Muslims as our primary target audience and basing research on Maqasid Methodology, we worked to ensure our activities matched these goals. By integrating our educational initiatives with academic research and public outreach, and by connecting our global membership to meaningful volunteer pathways, we established an institutional approach that allows us to continue promoting purposefulness, connectivity, and holism, and to demonstrate the necessity of this approach in solving real-life challenges.

## 2. Education

### Reforming Thinking, Transforming Lives

One of the most significant transformations of 2025 was the operationalization of our core educational philosophy: Revelation Thinking and Living (RTL).


The Emergence of RTL Building upon the "General Educational Program" envisioned in our 2023 report, RTL was introduced this year as a unified framework. It utilizes the AURA Strategy (Analyzing, Understanding, Reflecting, Acting) to ensure that knowledge begins with reflection and ends with lived transformation. This fulfills our long-standing educational objective to "empower learners to navigate the world's complexities, guided by Divine wisdom".

The Foundational and Applied Learning framework was established through two major milestones:



#### Reframing the Mind

The launch of our foundational course, Revelation-Centric Thinking in a Confused World, which introduced hundreds of learners to the Qur'anic model of conceptual realignment.




#### Reading the Book of Nature

Reading the Book of Nature (RBN) Retreat: Organized in partnership with Hearts SEE and the Istanbul Foundation for Science and Culture (IFSC), this immersive retreat allowed participants to practice "reading" the natural world as Qur'anic signs (ayat). This event was an on-site realization of the online course that was first introduced in 2024.



#### Qur'anic Tafsir

This foundational course was introduced together with Center for Muslim-Christian Studies, and it introduced learners to traditional and contemporary methodologies of the Qur'anic exegesis, including the Maqasidi Tafsir work of Prof. Dr. Jasser Auda is expected to complete in the next year.



## New MicroMasters Program

Furthermore, we finalized the development of our upcoming specialized MicroMasters Programs in Maqasid Studies, Education, Islamic Economics, Psychology, and Environmental Stewardship.

We simultaneously strengthened the Institute's rigorous academic pillars. 2025 marked the commencement of the inaugural course in our Methodologies for Interpreting the Qur'an program, a collaboration with Center for Muslim Christian Studies Houston.



## 3. Research & Impact

### Advancing Transdisciplinary & Phenomena Based Paradigm


In 2025, our Research Division focused on producing original scholarship demonstrating the epistemic power of Revelation within modern knowledge systems.

#### Impact across disciplines

Our research and educational initiatives are deeply trans-disciplinary, engaging with multiple critical areas of knowledge to demonstrate how Maqasid methodology offers vital insights into life, learning and leadership.

The interdisciplinary nature of our educational and research activities demonstrates the dynamic application of the Higher Objectives of the Revelation in all spheres of education and research, pushing the boundaries of its application.






## Book Launch: The publication of "Way to the Water: Quranic Truths, Prophetic Teachings and Sound Hearts"

In this book Dr. Basma illuminates the path to divine guidance—the Shariah—demonstrating that it demands both knowledge and application of Quranic truths and Prophetic wisdom. For only by cultivating the ayat within us can we nurture sound hearts, and faithfully carry the Trust. This work builds upon the "Women Empowerment Programs" and Quranic research prioritized in our 2023 report.


## Qur'anic Pedagogy

Dr. Basma commenced a new research fellowship at the Center for Islam in the Contemporary World at Shenandoah Valley University, focusing on the intersection of Maqasid methodology and pedagogy. This groundbreaking efforts is also supporting the Global Empowered Muslim (GEM) effort in the education track led a number of major organizations with a global vision and impact.

## Maqasid Al-Wahy Conference

MAFIS Conference held online on June 10-11, was an excellent collaborative effort of the Maqasid Institute, Research Synergy Foundation and ISTAC-IIUM. One of the main aims of this event was to reframe the Maqasid discourse away from Maqasid Al-Shari'ah to a more comprehensive perspective that advocates for holistic treatment of Allah's Revelation in all spheres of life, not only those areas that require legal opinion. So, this inaugural Maqasid Al-Wahy Conference succeeded in turning the discourse towards re-envisioning Islamic scholarship based on the ideas of purposefulness, connectivity and holism. The conference drew over 80 participants and 20+ research presentations. This event cemented MI's role as a hub for future-oriented academic engagement.

Applied Research Projects  
Our scholars continued to push boundaries in applied fields, continuing the momentum from the "Re-imagining Economics" initiative launched in 2023:



### Artificial Intelligence

Prof. Yasir Tarshani and Dr. Zaid Barzinji jointly presented a paper titled "Artificial intelligence: its rulings, guidelines, and ethics" at the International Islamic Fiqh Academy, 26<sup>th</sup> Session, in Qatar, May 2025.



### Economic Research Think Tank

Dr. Zaid Barzinji and Dr. Rafikov co-presented a proposal to establish a new economic think tank to a group of Muslim activists in the UK. The proposal focused on research center studying economic phenomena from a purpose-oriented transdisciplinary perspective.



### Economics

Dr. Ildus Rafikov has embarked on a research journey under the title "General Framework for Islamic Economic Phenomena". The framework represents a significant step forward towards reconstructing this field in line with the Institute's core mission.



### MSME social financing

Dr. Rafikov and Dr. Mohammad Sano developed an innovative social enterprise model for sustainability (RIZQ Community Partners Network) targeting small and micro-enterprises using a combination of zakah, waqf, micro-musharakah and group micro-takaful. This was presented during the MIFC Global Impact Challenge 2025 in September.



### Zakat Governance

A qualitative research on Zakat governance and management models practiced by the Turkish Red Crescent (Kızıl Ay) was conducted and submitted for publication by Enes Özcan under the supervision of Dr. Rafikov.

## Journal of Contemporary Maqasid Studies



The Maqasid Institute is pleased to announce the continued publication of the Journal of Contemporary Maqasid Studies (JCMS). The new Volume 4 was published in early 2025. This volume is a dedicated seventh issue examining the objectives and values of the Prophetic Sunnah. It features key research, including a notable article by Prof. Dr. Jasser Auda on "The Objectives as a Basis for an Integrated Framework and Methodology." This release underscores our ongoing commitment to advancing contemporary Maqasid scholarship.

The Journal's Editorial team was revamped with Prof. Dr Halim Rani (Australia) joining as a co-editor-in-chief along with Dr. Jamila Tilout (Morocco), and Dr. Ahmad Sykran Baharuddin (Malaysia) as the new managing editor. Research Synergy Press is the journal's new publisher, thus deepening the institute's partnership with the Research Synergy Foundation (Indonesia).

## 4. Global Reach

### Maqasid Network Membership & Partnerships

Our vision is global, but our impact is local. 2025 was a year of deepening our roots in key regions, with Maqasid Institute Indonesia serving as a model of regional success—a trajectory of growth we have nurtured since 2017.

Special attention was given this year to restructure membership of the Maqasid Network, which now has five categories catering to various interests and contribution levels. Each category also has its own set of privileges and a customized experience.

Becoming a part of the Maqasid Network offers unique opportunities for collaboration, personal growth, and meaningful impact, including:

## Institutional Partnerships

### Indonesia

We solidified our presence through MoUs with State Islamic Universities, including UIN K.H. Achmad Siddik (Jember) and UIN Imam Bonjol (Padang). This fulfills our strategic objective to "develop strategic partnerships with educational institutions."

**The Professor's Tour:** In November, Prof. Dr. Jasser Auda conducted a high-impact tour, delivering lectures on "Maqasid Shariah: Bridging Turaths and Contemporary Issues" at the Islamic University of Indonesia and addressing the future of Islamic thought at Gajah Mada University.

**Community Dialogue:** The chapter held bimonthly discussions tackling pressing local issues, such as Stunting Alleviation in West Sumatra and Utilitarianism.

Expanding the Footprint Beyond Indonesia, our scholars carried the Maqasid message to:

- **Kyrgyzstan:** Where the VP of Research taught a summer school on Reimagining Islamic Social Sciences.
- **Azerbaijan:** Where lectures on Maqasid Al-Shari'ah, Integration of Knowledge and Waqf were delivered to second year students of the Azerbaijan Institute of Theology.





## Institutional Partnerships

### Sri Lanka

In 2025, Maqasid Institute Sri Lanka focused on educational development, strategic partnerships, and the application of the Maqasid methodology to contemporary societal issues.

The year began with a strategic collaboration with the Center for Future Studies (CFS) to design a program series on applying Maqasid within the Sri Lankan context. This laid the groundwork for a major educational initiative: a month-long Introductory Course on Maqasid Methodology (April–May). Based on Prof. Jasser Auda's Re-envisioning Islamic Scholarship, the course featured local board members and a session by Prof. Auda, covering the historical and theoretical frameworks of the methodology.

Following a mid-year strategic analysis, the chapter launched a series of expert-led online seminars titled "Discussions in Maqasid Perspective," applying the methodology to specific fields:



#### Environmental Protection:

Mr. A. M. Riyas Ahamed led a session on biodiversity, the ecological crisis, and the imperative of sustainable stewardship.



#### Secular Education:

Prof. Dr. J. D. Careemdeen explored the balance between religious and worldly knowledge, addressing the intersection of Islamic epistemology and modern educational ethics.



#### Sri Lankan Muslim Politics:

Dr. Mohamed Fouz Mohamed Zacky and Mr. Siraj Mashhoor facilitated critical dialogues on the socio-political landscape and challenges facing the local Muslim community.

Through these initiatives, the chapter successfully fostered critical discourse, bridging theoretical Maqasid studies with practical challenges in education, politics, and the environment.


# 5. Our Community

## From Membership to Contribution

In 2025, we shifted our strategy from "membership as identity" to "membership as contribution". We aimed to transform our large base into an active learning ecosystem.

Empowering the Network To foster deeper engagement, we consolidated our digital communities into a unified WhatsApp ecosystem and clarified volunteer pathways. The Institute provided a dedicated members relations expert to provide support to MI members, learners and partners.

## Success Story

The Nigeria Cohort A highlight of our community investment was the scholarship program for our flagship courses (Tafsir and Reading the Book of Nature). Of the 32 full scholarships awarded, 18 went to members from Nigeria. This cohort demonstrated exceptional dedication, with Nigerian members comprising the majority of those who completed all three rigorous courses. This success validates our belief that well-directed support can activate vibrant knowledge communities.



# 6. Media & Digital Presence

## Amplifying the Message




Our Media Department focused on a dual strategy in 2025:


Global Brand Awareness and Audience Growth.

This resulted in quadrupling our social media reach as we welcomed over 20,000 new followers across our platforms.

Facebook was our primary traffic source, driving nearly **14,000** clicks to our courses and programs. The platform today has about **18,000** followers, our biggest, followed by YouTube with over **10,000** subscribers.



While we achieved a massive increase in outreach, we also identified the need to professionalize our content production to match the depth of our scholarship—a key priority we are carrying into the new year.

## The Horizon of 2026

2026 is set to be a year of expansion through alignment, where the foundations built in 2025 translate into deeper impact, clearer pathways, and a stronger global presence for the Maqasid Institute. Our focus will shift from establishing coherence to scaling our transformative programs and fortifying our global academic network.

### **Education**

The Education pillar will focus on creating structured and continuous learning pathways that move beyond foundational courses.

#### **Launch the MicroMasters Programs:**

We will officially launch the first cohort of our three structured MicroMasters Programs in Maqasid Studies, Education, Economics, and Environment. This will formalize a new tier of graduate-level specialization, providing transdisciplinary thought leaders with in-depth methodological training grounded in Revelation.

#### **Expand RTL Thematic Offerings:**

The Revelation Thinking and Living (RTL) framework will be extended with new applied thematic courses. These will move beyond the foundational Reframing the Mind course to address specific contemporary issues, connecting the philosophical lens with practical areas of life, such as wealth management, family relationships, and ethics in technology.

#### **Strengthen the MI Learning Community:**

We will implement guided engagement pathways to transform the learning experience from passive consumption to active contribution, ensuring long-term intellectual growth and collaboration among participants of the RTL and Graduate Studies programs.



## Research

The Research pillar will continue to advance a revelation-based academic paradigm and strengthen global research alliances.

### Introduce the Qur'anic Pedagogy Research Track:

This new, dedicated research track will begin with the initial work and fellowship established in 2025, moving toward a full-fledged program that explores revelation-centered methodologies for education, curriculum development, and human flourishing.

### Host MAFIS-II (Maqasid al-Wahy and the Future of Interdisciplinary Scientific Research - II):

Building on the success of the 2025 conference, the second international MAFIS event will serve as the premier annual academic forum, driving interdisciplinary knowledge production and fostering strategic research collaborations with global institutions.

### Advance Collaborative Research and Publications:

We will leverage the sustained collaborative relationship inaugurated with RSF (Indonesia) to support joint research projects and publications across the entire Maqasid Network (MN), specifically focusing on moving the conceptual work from 2025 into tangible scholarly outputs.



## Network

The Global Network will focus on deepening roots and cultivating active ecosystems in key regions.

### Activate Regional Chapters:

Strategic support and resources will be dedicated to the official activation of regional chapters, including Maqasid Institute Malaysia and Maqasid Institute India, replicating the successful model established by MI Indonesia.

### Continue Bimonthly Scholarly Discussions:

The Indonesian model of bimonthly discussions will be scaled across the Global Network to maintain momentum in applying the Maqasid Methodology to new contemporary challenges and fostering continuous intellectual engagement.

### Expand Structured Pathways for Contribution:

The pathways for contribution (research, active participation, fellowship) will be formalized and promoted to ensure that the membership network consistently evolves into an ecosystem of active contributors, driving the collective scholarly and educational output.



## Partnerships

The Partnerships strategy will aim to establish institutional permanence and secure accreditation.

### Deepen Strategic Collaborations with Universities:

We will finalize and deepen collaborations with new university partners in Asia, the United States, and beyond, focusing on institutionalizing the delivery of our Diploma and MicroMasters programs.

### Advance MI's Role within the GEMS Initiative:

We will move from strategic committee participation to concrete project execution within the GEMS Collaborative Committee, ensuring MI's methodological framework plays a critical role in shaping global Muslim futures.

### Explore New Avenues for Academic Accreditation and Cross-Regional Program Delivery:

Active steps will be taken to secure formal academic accreditation for our Graduate Studies programs and to establish mechanisms for seamless, accredited cross-regional delivery.



## Media

The Media department will transform momentum into a sustainable, professional system for global reach.

### Strengthen Digital Reach and Conversion Systems:


The department will address the identified technical issues with the website's email system and invest in professional workflows and dedicated resources to enhance video content quality, thereby improving the entire digital conversion pipeline.

### Expand Academic Influence Through Targeted Content:

We will strategically use platforms like LinkedIn and YouTube to promote long-form lectures and research articles, reinforcing MI's academic authority and expanding its intellectual footprint among professional and academic audiences.

### Enhance Community Engagement Across Social Media Platforms:

We will leverage the strong engagement quality seen on LinkedIn and Instagram, creating more short, impactful videos and reels, while using Facebook's strong conversion pipeline to support course registrations for flagship program



## 8. 2025 Budget & 2026 Forecast

The Institute's budget remained highly efficient given the extensive size of our operations and achievements in 2025. MI's staffing remained steady at three full-time and three part-time staff members. The major drivers of this high efficiency and impact level are MI's members volunteering extensive time and expert effort, and the partnerships we have developed globally. For example, MI's flagship research event and journal management are handled entirely through the dedicated services of the incredible professional team at the Research Synergy Foundation, based in Indonesia.

**The 2026 budget** is expected to remain at this core level of operations. However, a major effort is planned towards business development and fundraising. The goal is to fund MI's MicroMasters programing initiative through partnerships with major accredited institutions in the US and globally.
